History

W. A. Pattillo Alumni Association, Inc.

The W. A. Pattillo Alumni Association was the vision of four individuals: Nathan Lewis, William Boyd, Rayfield Perkins, and George Worsley. Following a financially successful reunion in 1978, Nathan Lewis and members of the Class of 1955 agreed to donate the proceeds to organize an alumni association. Planning meetings were scheduled with Nathan, Rayfield and William encouraging other graduates to attend along with George contacting members of the classes of 1939, 1940, and 1941. The "vision" was taking shape and the participants established national alumni associations since many participants were from out-of-state, mainly Philadelphia, PA and Washington, DC.

In 1981, former students of the Tarboro colored High School, the W.A. Pattillo High School and Princeville Elementary School gathered for the first reunion. The Tarboro Colored High School group had been informally organized in the late 1970s and this membership basically included the graduating classes of 1924 through 1943. Those involved with this group were Ethel Lewis, Helen Knight, William Ruffin, Grady Ashe, Elizabeth McMillian, Susanna Thomas, George Matthewson, Maude Bullock Porter, Lorna Pitt and others. The "plan" was in motion.

After the first reunion, more supporters came. They were Eunice Parker, Evelyn Faulk, Grace Swinson, Iris Braswell, Rev. James Wooten, Myrna Deloatch, Hubert Simmons, Charlie Brown, Elizabeth McMillan, Helen Newton Knight, George Matthewson, and Lois Cobb. The "dream" was taking shape. At this time, Nathan Lewis served as Interim National President and Iris Braswell was elected as the Tarboro Chapter President. In 1982, Alfred Norfleet was elected as the Washington, DC President and in 1983; Grady Ashe was elected as the Baltimore Chapter President. In 1983, under the leadership of President, Earlene Womack Lawrence, the alumni association obtained its state charter and was incorporated as the W.A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association, Incorporated. Charter members were Jimmie Bullock, Thomas Perry, Grady E. Ashe, Lorna

Lloyd, Helen Knight, Iris Braswell, Cora Boddie and George Matthewson.

In 1985 the Tidewater Chapter was formed. The "vision" had become a reality. The past presidents have been Nathan Lewis, Jimmie Bullock, Barbara Bratcher Anderson, Earlene Knight Womack, Eva Norfleet, Thomas Newton, and Varnell Vines Kinnin. The association's current president is Fred S. Wood, Jr.

After a re-organization in July 2002, the purpose of the Association was revised, and according to its articles of incorporation, is to (1) provide scholarship, grants, etc. to students which the organization deems worthy of the same for purposes of assisting them in furthering their education; (2) provide financial and other assistance to educational institutions at all levels; (3) purchase books, equipment, etc. for the benefit and use of educational, social and civic organizations whose purposes or functions are related to promoting and enriching the lives of citizens; and, (4) promote and conduct social programs and events in communities for purposes of raising funds and promoting communications. Since the inception of the alumni association, approximately \$80,000 in scholarship funds have been awarded to area high school students to attend four-year colleges, community colleges and universities throughout the United States.

Under the present leadership of President Wood, the Officers and Board of Directors, the organization is forging into the 21st century in a concerted effort to promote and expand the focus of W. A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association, Inc. and to broaden its scope in the local, state and national communities.

Distinguished Pattillo Alumni 2013



Earl T. Brown, Esq., a 1969 honor graduate of W. A. Pattillo High School, was born and reared in Princeville by his mother, Anna B. Brown He has three sisters.

During his high school days in Tarboro, he worked at Marrow Pitt Hardware, Sugar's and Brill's Department Stores, Deluxe Cleaners, and mowing lawns, with summer jobs at car dealerships in Arlington, Va.

He graduated from North Carolina A & T State University with a BS degree. After North Carolina A & T State University he began a career in computer systems design and support with Jefferson Pilot Insurance Company, then UNC-Chapel Hill, North Carolina Mutual Insurance in Durham, and Burroughs Wellcome Pharmaceuticals in Greenville.

After arriving in Greenville, he taught computer programming and flying classes at Pitt Community College, and Operated Martin County Airport, while starting Aero Sales Ltd. (an aviation business). After 19 years of working in the computer industry, Mr. Brown decided to pursue his dream of becoming an attorney. He attended and graduated from Campbell University School of Law.

Currently, Attorney Brown is sworn to practice before the U.S. Supreme and Federal District Courts. He is a Superior Court Certified Mediator and a Court Approved Arbitrator. Attorney Brown also lists among his memberships the Eastern North Carolina Inn of Court, North Carolina Academy of Trial Lawyers, American Bar Association, North Carolina Bar Association; Attorney for Law Enforcement Officers provided through Divisions of Southern States Police Benevolent Association, Inc. ("PBA"), and the Fraternal Order of Police ("FOP") for Beaufort, Pitt, Lenoir and Martin Counties, including the cities of Greenville, Williamston, and Washington.

During his career as an attorney, he has served as the President of the Pitt County Bar Association and as an Assistant District Attorney. Attorney Brown has also served as the chairman of the Judiciary District 3--A Grievance Committee of the North Carolina State Bar; and as a member of the Elizabeth City State University Board of Trustees, Trustee Emeritus of Elizabeth City State University's Board of Visitors, a member of the Historical Murfreesboro Commission, a member of the WEED and SEED Steering Committee of Pitt County; Juvenile Crime Prevention Council; and the Paralegal Advisory Board of Pitt Community College.

Since 1991, Attorney Brown has presented seminars to different legal groups on computerization of law offices. He has served as a member of the planning committee for the ABA's annual Computer Technology Conference. Additionally, Attorney Brown is a motivational counselor in the area schools and is a volunteer mediator for the Eastern Carolina Mediation Center. For his outstanding work in his profession and the community, he has received recognition as a Distinguished Alumnus of both North Carolina A & T State University and Campbell University School of Law.

Attorney Brown is married to Dr. H. J. Brown, a dentist. They have one son, Attorney Derek K. Brown, the managing partner of the Brown Law Firm, P.C.

Distinguished Pattillo Alumni 2013



Janice Bryant Howroyd was born around 1953 in Tarboro, North Carolina, as one of 11 children in her family. She is a 1970 graduate of W.A. Pattillo High School and received her bachelor's degree in English from North Carolina A&T State University. She later was awarded an honorary doctorate in humanities from North Carolina A&T State University.

After finishing her schooling, Howroyd visited her sister in Los Angeles and soon decided to stay there. She went to work as her brother-in-law's assistant at Billboard and noticed that most of the magazine's employees worked there in order to either break into the entertainment business or make money while waiting for their big breaks. Howroyd also noticed that she had an affinity for organization and employee

placement. She stated in Black Enterprise, "I realized that I enjoyed helping people get temporary and permanent jobs. When someone told me to hang out my own shingle, I took the chance" (August 2003). She saved money and later borrowed from her family in order to start her own employment-service agency. With a small office in Beverly Hills and with one phone, the life of her company ACT*1 Personnel Services began.

Janice Bryant Howroyd, as the founder and CEO of the Act•1 Group, built the organization into a global leader in the staffing and human resources industry. Howroyd built her business on two principles: the "WOMB" method and the notion of "keeping the humanity in Human Resources." The letters in "WOMB" stood for "Word of Mouth, Brother!" Howroyd guaranteed companies that she would find qualified employees or return any payment received. Headquartered in Los Angeles, Ca. USA, her company creates and implements innovative technologies and global business solutions through the Agile.1 brand, that allow firms to optimize their talent pools and bottom line via resource management. Her AppleOne group is the largest privately held staffing company in the USA, and her A-Check America group offers background and drug screening globally. As a leader in the human resources industry, Mrs. Howroyd's organizations work with businesses of all sizes, from start-ups to global conglomerates. A sought-after speaker and lecturer, Mrs. Howroyd embodies the importance of combining education and entrepreneurship with service. She shares her unique understanding of the challenges faced by American workers and business owners alike, and has regularly appeared on CNBC's Street Signs to provide her perspective on the monthly Jobs Report. Recently, she compiled practical as well as motivating solutions in her book, The Art of Work: How to Make Work, Work for You!

Janice Bryant Howroyd, is active in her community. She served on the U.S. Department of Labor's Workforce Initiative Board, Loyola Marymount University's board of regents, and the Women's Leadership Board of the Women and Public Policy Program at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government.

Distinguished Pattillo Alumni 2013

Dr. Frank B. Weaver, one of four children, was born in Tarboro, North Carolina. His father, William Weaver, was a trained barber and his mother, Annie Daisy Moore Weaver, was a housewife and seamstress. The family resided at 906 E. Wilson in East Tarboro.

A 1944 Graduate of the W.A. Pattillo High School he obtained his B.S. from Fayetteville State University; his M.A. degree at Columbia University and his Ed.D. at Pennsylvania State University.

After graduation from Fayetteville State University he taught two years at John R. Hawkins in Warren County and he was the Assistant Principal for grades one through

six. During the 1950/51 school year he was the Principal of the Providence Rosenwald School in Edgecombe County. He was asked by the Superintendent at the time, E. D. Johnson, and W. W. Green, Chairman of the Edgecombe County Board of Education, to organize and be Principal of the newly constructed Roberson Elementary School. There he served from 1951 to 1956, after which he was asked again to organize and serve as Principal of the new Willow Grove School. He was Principal there from 1956 to 1962. He began working in Raleigh in 1962 for the State Superintendent of Elementary Education in the Department of Public Instruction where he served until 1967.

From 1967 to 1970 he served as consultant and Assistant Director in the Division of Continuing Education of the North Carolina Department of Community Colleges. Then he served as Associate Superintendent of Instruction in the Durham City Schools and was Interim Superintendent in 1970. He retired in 1982, having had several titles during his tenure with the Durham City School system. These titles were Assistant Superintendent, Associate Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent, and Acting Superintendent. He returned to the Durham City Schools as Interim Superintendent from 1988 to 1989. During his entire educational career he also was pastor to a total of five churches and pastor of Watson Chapel Missionary Baptist Church in Raleigh for 34 years. His other churches were in Edgecombe County.

Several of his articles are published. Vantage Press of New York City published his first book in 1967 – *Practical Help for Meeting Needs of Slow Learners*. Class Publishing Company of Brentwood, Maryland, published his second book in 1971 – *Helping Slow Learners and Undereducated Adults*. He developed five adult education resource guides for the Division of Adult Education, Department of Community Colleges. The titles are: (1) *Tips for Teaching Adults the Language Arts*; (2) *Tips for Teaching Adults the Social Studies*; (3) *Resources for Adult Educators*; (4) *Techniques for Teaching Adults*; and (5) *How to Recruit ABE Students*.

His educational and religious travels have taken him to Canada, Mexico, Israel, France, Jordan, Greece and Africa. He toured the Holy Land in 1970. In November, 1973, he toured the U.S.S.R. and Finland and observed their educational programs.

Dr. Weaver attributes his success to a close-knit family, parents with educational expectations for their children, his belief in God, and the encouragement and support from the love of his life, his wife, Queen. They are parents of one child, Frank B. Weaver, Jr., and grandparents to Frankie's two children. The couple is retired and resides in Raleigh, NC.
