Our Achievements and Highlights

Flood Relief Efforts. The Administration took to heart the toll that the flooding from Hurricane Matthew had in Tarboro and Princeville on individuals and families. We collaborated with the two Relief Centers in Tarboro at Eastern Star Baptist and Saint Paul Baptist Churches to aid individuals affected. We placed in those centers \$5 Coupons that individuals could redeem at the local Bryan Drug Store for toiletries. A total of \$5,000 in coupons was placed in these centers.

We also addressed the needs of the students at Princeville School by providing clothing items as Christmas gifts in conjunction with other activities that were occurring for the students. A total of \$2,000 was directed to this project to bring some elements of joy and happiness to the students as they moved into the Christmas season.

Over 50% of the funds for these projects were donated by individuals not affiliated with the Association and outside of Tarboro and Princeville.



PUBLICATION Committee.

Continued to develop and implement oversight programs for all official publications. It served as the approving authority for all posts to Facebook and the Webpage. The committee assured that we deported ourselves in a proper and profession manner for all media in the public domain. Several

articles related to various facets of the Association or Alumni were published in local newspapers and the Edgecombe County Public School (ECPS) webpage. Other vital functions such as: Developing & publishing "The Trojan Newsletter" and the "Reunion Souvenir Booklet" were completed. The "Reunion Souvenir Booklet" is the committee's largest annual project.

SCHOLARSHIP Committee. Mounted its Annual Scholarship Fundraising Campaign that totaled almost \$9,000. Selected ten senior to receive the W.A. Pattillo, Thelma Q. Forster and Nathan Lewis Scholarships. Coordinated financial awards to Pattillo and Princeville Schools and awarded the "Mr. James Edward Bridgers Incentive Award"



to ten ECPS elementary and middle school students. The committee served as a constant interface with the ECPS.

HALL OF FAME Committee. Modified the procedures and some criteria to make the process smoother and a bit more usable for members to nominate individuals for induction into the Hall of Fame. Retained the present procedure for individuals to be selected for the Distinguished Graduate Chapter. Inducted the W. A. Pattillo High School 1969 Championship Football Team into the Hall of Fame.

MEMBERSHIP Committee. Mounted its annual Membership Drive eliciting a representative from each class or class cluster for assistance. The committee continued to restructure and revise its databases as it responded to natural attrition. The committee continued to serve as the unit to direct mailings to the population of the database.
